
# Gloucestershire Primary Care Network (PCN) Newsletter

# **Actions for this month:**

**PCN Sustainability Fund 2022/23:** Thank you all for returning the Sustainability Fund 2022/23 MOU. We would like to remind you that the PCN needs to submit the short self-assessment template (Appendix 1 of the MOU) to confirm that the PCN have completed their activity/intentions for the Sustainability Fund by **31**st **December 2022**.

**Review ARR Claims:** Please can PCNs review their ARR claims for this financial year ahead of year end to ensure they are up to date and accurate. As of February/March 2023 there will be changes to the ARRs portal to link with PCSE, the PCN Team are awaiting further details from NHSE/I & PCSE and will share as soon as possible.

**NWRS:** Please can PCNs login into the NWRS system, review and, if required, update your workforce data ensuring it matches ARR claims. PCN staff are required to be recorded, including CDs. Further guidance available <a href="here">here</a>

#### **CVD Clinical Programme Group Update:**

Dr Kok-Swee Gan, Dr Robin Hollands, and Helen Turner have recently completed a pilot project on the IIF CVD:04. Through that work, a One Gloucestershire Primary Care FH Case Finding pathway, referral proforma and GP assessment form have been developed. The CVD Team are working to publish the pathway and associated documents on G-care in the new year. A training session for Primary Care on the FH Pathway will be held on the 6<sup>th</sup> of January from 12-1.30pm to help PCNs achieve the IIF target CVD-04. ## **SPOTLIGHT ON ARRs – Clinical Pharmacists**

We are planning to shine a spotlight on individual ARRs roles within the PCN newsletter, in a series of bite sized briefings. Our next spotlight role is Clinical Pharmacists.

- Did you know that Clinical Pharmacists in Primary Care can cover the below areas and more?
  - Working with GPs and patients to resolve day-to-day medication queries
  - supporting person-centred care and shared decision making around medicines
  - Structured medication reviews (SMR)
  - Triaging and managing common ailments as well as supporting care navigation to the Community Pharmacy Consultation Service (CPCS)
  - Managing and prescribing for long term conditions (often with practice nurses or other clinical staff)
  - Helping deliver aspects of QOF and IIF (impact and investment fund)
  - Multi-disciplinary case reviews, which may include work as part of the enhanced health in care home indicators
  - Face-to-face or telephone consultations with patients
  - Supporting with medication changes for patients recently discharged from hospital
  - Quality improvement work and medical education

# Developing Professional Practice and Personal Leadership Skills programme for Health Care Support Workers

Healthcare Support Workers (HCSWs) play a key role in delivering excellent patient care within general practice, and therefore developing and retaining those workers is key to developing a workforce that is capable of meeting the future needs of the NHS.

The Developing Professional Practice and Personal Leadership Skills programme is a 12 week, Level 4/Certificate programme designed for HCSWs and HCAs who wish to develop their professional skills and, in future, progress to a Nurse Associate role. Through this unique programme of interactive blended online learning, students will learn to reflect and build on their existing knowledge and experience in order to respond to future healthcare requirements and confidently manage change in the workplace.

Completion of the programme is intended to support career progression by providing an enriched focus on quality care and support for people living with long-term conditions. The course aims to support learners to:

- Develop their personal leadership skills in order to take a more proactive role in practice improvement; and
- Develop a reflective approach to learning that enables constructive evaluation of their own knowledge and skills; and prepare for future study
- Discover Higher Education Institutes in their area that provide the Trainee Nurse Associate funded progression route
