
Gloucestershire Primary Care Network (PCN) Newsletter

Actions for this month:

PCN ARR Workforce Plans – Indicative recruitment plans through to 23/24 are required to be submitted via the <u>national portal</u> by 31st October 2022. If PCNs included their 23/24 recruitment intentions in the August return they are still required to resubmit by 31st October. PCNs will be able to make revisions to their 22/23 workforce plans, bearing in mind any underspend your PCN previously agreed to release to the countywide underspend is no longer available. A PCN Capacity and Access Support Payment is being put in place of the retired IIF indicator (ACC-05), to paid in 6 equal monthly instalments, for the period of 1st October to 31st March 2023. PCNs are required to commit in writing to the ICB to reinvest the funding into additional workforce and increased clinical capacity to support additional appointments and access for patients. Please can PCNs send their declarations to the PCN Mailbox.

Latest Updates:

PCSE Payments/Portal Access:

As you are aware the PCN payments have changed this month, moving from CQRS to PCSE. Unfortunately, this has resulted in a number of national errors being made by PCSE, including split payment dates. The PCN Team have been informed by PCSE that they are still working on the access to the portal for PCN's. Further information will be shared once it has been released by PCSE.

Supporting Annual Health Checks for People with a Learning Disability:
