
Gloucestershire Primary Care Network (PCN) Newsletter

Actions for this month:

Review ARR Claims: Please can PCNs review their ARR claims for this financial year ahead of year end to ensure they are up to date and accurate. As of February/March 2023 there will be changes to the ARRs portal to link with PCSE, the PCN Team are awaiting further details from NHSE/I & PCSE and will share as soon as possible.

NWRS: Please can PCNs login into the NWRS system, review and, if required, update your workforce data ensuring it matches ARR claims. PCN staff are required to be recorded, including CDs. Further guidance available here

SPOTLIGHT ON ARRS – Occupational Therapists

We are planning to shine a spotlight on individual ARRs roles within the PCN newsletter, in a series of bite sized briefings. Our next spotlight role is Occupational Therapists.

Did you know that Occupational Therapists in Primary Care can cover the below areas and more?

- Use of frailty indexes to identify individuals needing a proactive approach.
- Rapid crisis response to prevent hospital admission or to speed discharge.
- Assessment and interventions to ensure individuals can manage independently at home, including support for carers.
- Risk assessment for acute distress.
- Personalised care plans for self-management.
- Individual discussions to identify personal goals and motivation.
