Programme requirements

Attendance at the programme is free of charge. However, participants must be committed to attending all five days, and to completing some progress assignments on the application of an improvement approach in practice.

You will be allocated a link teaching associate to offer advice, coaching and support.

Following the programme, your team will then produce a poster to share your project outputs and learning and will have the opportunity to present at QSIR Practitioner Celebration Event.

We recommend that you register as soon as possible, as the workshops only have a limited number of
